

## Minutes of 21<sup>st</sup> Meeting of the National Skills Qualifications Committee (NSQC)

Venue: National Skills Development Agency (NSDA), B-2, Pusa Road,  
Kaushal Bhawan, New Delhi 110005

The 21<sup>st</sup> meeting of the National Skills Qualifications Committee (NSQC) was held on 03<sup>rd</sup> August, 2018 at National Skill Development Agency (NSDA), New Delhi under the Chairmanship of Shri K.P. Krishnan, Chairman, NSDA and Secretary, Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE). The list of participants is at **Annexure I**. The meeting discussed total of 17 agenda items.

### **Agenda Item I: To confirm the minutes of the 20<sup>th</sup> Meeting of NSQC**

The Committee approved the minutes of 20<sup>th</sup> meeting of NSQC. No comments were received from any of the members.

### **Agenda Item II: Action Taken Report on the minutes of the 20<sup>th</sup> Meeting of NSQC**

The Committee was apprised of the action taken by NSDA on the minutes of the 20<sup>th</sup> meeting of NSQC.

- (i) **Mapping of SSCs with the Line Ministries:** The Committee was informed that the NSDA has mapped the Sector Skills Councils (SSCs) with relevant Line Ministries. The guidelines for interface between SSCs and Line Ministries are being circulated by MSDE. In case of, overlap of Ministries, the more closely related Ministry would be mapped as Primary Ministry and others would be mapped as Secondary Ministries.
- (ii) **Uploading of Accreditation Norms on NQR:** Committee was apprised that currently very few SSCs have uploaded accreditation norms on NQR inspite of such directions in the 19<sup>th</sup> and the 20<sup>th</sup> NSQC. Chairman, NSQC instructed NSDC to designate one officer to liaison with NSDA on the issue of submission of specific job-role wise accreditation norms in the Qualification Files (QF). The officer would also be present in the next NSQC to apprise the Committee in this regard. The SSCs are given another 03 months time to upload their accreditation norms in the NQR.
- (iii) **Co-opting NSDC as member:** The Chief Operating Officer, NSDC is co-opted as 'Core Member' of NSQC till the regulatory function in NSDC is transferred to NSDA.

### **Agenda Item III: Note on leveling of Qualifications under NSQF**

A presentation on a concept paper on "leveling of Qualifications under NSQF" was made by Consultant NSDA. Approval of NSQC was solicited for constituting an

expert Committee for wider consultation with all stakeholders with direction to provide an update in the next NSQC. ***The Chairman directed NSDA to setup the Committee in two week's time.***

#### **Agenda Item IV: Approval on draft NSQF handbook**

In compliance to the decision taken in 19<sup>th</sup> NSQC Meeting, a Hand Book on NSQF alignment was prepared by NSDA which was placed before the Committee. The handbook consists of NSQF process flow, timelines, web links of necessary Performa's, documents etc. for easy understanding of the NSQF alignment procedure. ***NSQC approved the same.***

#### **Agenda Item V: NOS approval process and creation of NOS repository**

In compliance to the decision taken in the 20<sup>th</sup> NSQC meeting, a concept note on NOS based approval process and creation of NOS repository was presented by Principal Consultant, NSDA. NSQC was informed that paper would be circulated among all the concerned stakeholders namely NSDC, DGT, CSTARI and State Govt. to have wider consultation. ***Chairman, NSQC suggested to consult international institutions such as DFID for wider consultation. Joint Secretary (SD), MSDE informed that funds under SANKALP project can be utilized for this purpose.*** DG, NSDA indicated that we are already in consultation with DFID and World Bank.

In the light of above, the proposal of M/s MeriTrain Education Services for NSQF alignment of their Qualification on English as employability skills would be considered once NOS based approval process and system is in place. The Committee, however, suggested to have a NOS based approval process and system in place before deciding on individual proposal.

#### **Agenda Item VI: Report of Committee on Duplication and status of de-duplication exercise**

The report of a Committee on duplication of qualifications was presented to the NSQC. ***The Committee directed NSDA to share the report among concerned stakeholders for wider consultations.*** The committee was also apprised of the status of de-duplication of Qualifications work done by NSDA.

#### **Agenda Item VII: Ex-post facto approval of job roles executed under PMKVY and PMKK and other decisions related to its implementation**

NSQC was apprised about the decision taken during the meeting held on 8<sup>th</sup> June 2018 in MSDE (Annexure II). ***The Committee accorded ex-post facto approval to the decision taken in the meeting and authorized DG, NSDA to take decision on similar issues, if presented by NSDC.***

### **Agenda Item VIII: Migration of MES courses to SSCs**

In continuation to the decision taken by MSDE, the Committee was informed that DGT has given NOC to NSDC to enable SSCs to become Awarding Body for the MES courses subject to the following conditions-

- DGT Ecosystem will continue to run some MES short term courses for upskilling of ITI instructors and Industrial workers and as bridge courses for instructors to teach across different stream and for multi skilling.
- The Directorate has no objection to SSCs running MES courses with their own assessment and issuing certificates with only SSC branding. As DGT machinery will not be involved in setting of examination papers and assessment/invigilation, the use of NCVT logo and dual certification can't be done.
- The relationship with SSC will be on reciprocal basis and DGT eco system may run some NQR courses where awarding body is SSCs to skill youth, including those coming from SC/ST & rural background, tribal areas, LWE areas at a much subsidized rates, which could be at a fraction of the fee charged by private institutes.

***The NSQC approved the same and accorded approval to DGT also to assess and certify SSC owned Qualifications.***

### **Agenda Item IX: Empanelment of Skill Assessors and certification for CBSE schools**

Committee was apprised that CBSE has requested MSDE to empanel their own assessors for vocational qualifications for which SSCs are the awarding bodies. Further, it was informed that the content for these qualifications is developed by PSSCIVE, Bhopal. ***The Committee decided that as CBSE is already a Certifying Body under NSQF, CBSE can empanel its own assessor and issue certificates for SSC courses also (list of courses at Annexure III). However, CBSE will have to ensure that assessment is as per NSQF guidelines. Further, the committee instructed NSDA to develop process audit guidelines as per NQAF for all Awarding Bodies under NSQF.***

### **Agenda Item X: Consideration of multiple Awarding Bodies for NSQF aligned courses**

The Committee was informed that NSDA had received proposals from government institutions such as Skill Universities, KVIC, NiMSME and State Govt. & their institutions such as Haryana Knowledge Corporation Limited etc. to become Awarding Body for NSQF aligned qualifications. The committee was also apprised that in-principle decision was also taken in the 20<sup>th</sup> meeting of NSQC to consider multiple Awarding Bodies for each NSQF aligned qualifications.

***The Committee decided that Skill Universities created by Act of State/ Union and approved by UGC for awarding degrees may be considered to become Awarding Bodies under NSQF for the courses in skills domain only. However, each such University would have to approach NSDA and an expert committee may be constituted by the Chairman, NSQC to assess the capacity and capability of the University as Awarding Body under NSQF. The terms of reference of the Expert Committee may be decided by NSDA with the approval of Chairman, NSQC.***

**Agenda Item XI: To consider Centurion University of Technology and Management (CUTM) as Awarding Body for NSQF qualifications.**

Representative from Centurion University of Technology and Management (CUTM) made presentation on their capacity and capabilities to conduct assessment and certification of NSQF aligned qualifications in skill domain. It was also informed that CUTM has been notified as Skill University by Odisha Government (**Annexure IV**) and has shared the list of courses for which they are seeking Awarding Rights.

Considering that CUTM is already a Skill University approved by UGC to award degree and is assessment body for MES qualifications, ***the Committee decided to accord in-principle approval to CUTM as Awarding Body under NSQF for different NSQF aligned qualifications (Annexure V). An expert committee would be constituted by the Chairman, NSQC to visit the University as per the terms of reference decided by NSDA with the approval of Chairman, NSQC before notification.***

**Agenda Item XII: To allow KVIC and Ni-MSME for assessment and certification of NSQF aligned Qualifications**

(a) **KVIC:** KVIC shared the presentation on their overall capability and capacity of assessment and certification. It also informed that the primary reason for seeking Awarding rights is to reduce expenditure for third part assessment and certification. ***The Committee suggested that a meeting may be organized at the level of Secretary MSME and Secretary MSDE along with CEO KVIC to understand the requirement of KVIC before a final decision is taken by the NSQC.***

(b) **Ni-MSME:** Ni-MSME shared the presentation on their overall capability and capacity of assessment and certification Qualifications. It was observed that Ni-MSME is primarily into training space and emphasized on the need of having clearly defined fire walls between training and certification system as in case of CIPET. ***It was decided that Ni-MSME case may also be discussed during the meeting for KVIC matter with Secretary, MSME.***

### **Agenda Item XIII: To consider the Qualification Files received from Submitting Bodies**

The Consultant, NSDA presented QFs of their respective sectors to the Committee for consideration of NSQF alignment. The following discussion and decision was taken:

#### **i. Aviation**

The 26 qualifications (8 MRO and 18 Airlines & Airport) have been approved by the Committee. List of all approved Qualifications is at **Annexure VI**. Further, the Chairman, NSDA directed to take two actions in regards to all Qualifications:

- 1. Each SSC that constantly creates new job roles should have adequate justification for creating new NOSs specific to the sector. There should be justified distinction from the other sector qualifications. NSDA and NSDC need to check for adequate justification from submitting bodies.**
- 2. In case of cross cutting qualifications, relevant multiple stakeholders should be consulted and contribution from them should be sought while creating new Qualifications/NOSs.**
- 3. Chairman, NSQC emphasized that there should be a provision to transfer credit between the qualifications.**

#### **ii. Agriculture**

A total of 23 Qualifications were approved by the NSQC (**Annexure VI**). DG, DGT enquired about qualification dealing with processing aspect of Fisheries and ASCI informed that food processing sector is seized with this issue.

***The Chairman NSQC directed ASCI to assess requirement of State of Uttarakhand regarding Cold Water Fisheries. Agriculture SSC informed about developing qualification for the same.***

#### **iii. Logistics**

It was stated that there was no the Line Ministry comment/ concurrence as logistics sector cuts across various Ministries of Government of India. It was also informed that Logistics SSC as well as NSDA had tried to coordinate with various potential Line Ministries like Ministry of Commerce and Industries, Ministry of Road Transport and Highways, Ministry of Food Processing, and other government agencies like Central Warehousing Corporation and Central Railside Warehouse Company Limited but haven't received response.

The Chairman, NSQC indicated that there are multiple ministries and coordination is a difficult task. The possibility of constituting a one-time task force with a Chairman, representative from the line ministry and representative from the private sector was discussed. The members will change depending on the QP under consideration and

the ministry. The Task Force will sort out the issues and send to the Logistics Department for final approval

***The committee agreed with the suggestion of constituting one time task force.***

The committee, further, enquired from the SSC w.r.t any urgency of these qualifications to avoid operational impediments. The CEO, SSC informed that these are rationalized files for which training has to start since there is a huge demand for them. NSDC was asked to help the SSC in operationalizing and implementing these Qualification. NSDC raised the issue of Cost Common Norm request submitted by Logistics SSC and it was decided that Economic Advisor, MSDE will look into the matter.

***In view of above, the Committee accorded in-principle approval for 24 Qualification Files (Annexure VI) on the condition that SSC has to incorporate the changes (even during the course of operationalization of these Qualification Files) as per the suggestions in the stakeholder meeting which shall be conducted by the Logistics Division of Ministry of Commerce and Industries. These Qualification Files shall be presented in the next NSQC in case of any major changes/ suggestions. Otherwise these will be considered NSQC approved if there is no substantive change required in the files.***

#### **iv. Leather**

NSQC suggested that the Qualifications of Shoe Maker and Footwear and Allied Goods Repairer pecked at higher level. The committee stated that the two qualifications level needs to be relooked by the SSC and the same was suggested by DG, DGT. ***It was decided that the Leather SSC would reduce the level of two qualification files, namely Shoe Maker and Footwear and Allied Goods Repairer to level 3 and level 2 respectively. (Annexure VI).***

#### **v. Mining**

***NSQC suggested that the entry level requirement should be specific and not just ITI passed for the qualification of Surface Miner Operator. The SSC was advised to re-visit the entry level requirement for the Surface Miner Operator qualification.***

DGMS, Ministry of Labour informed that according to Mines Vocational Training Rules (MVTR), 1966 it is mandatory for every mining company to provide training to the new employees for certain days. The MVTR is in process of amendment and the NSQC committee stated that MSDE, NSDA and the SSC related to mining may be consulted as any change in business of skilling in mining will spill to MSDE, NSDA and SSCs. The committee approved the qualifications files (**Annexure VI**).

#### **vi. Gems & Jewellery**

The files were deferred due to non representation of the Submitting Body.

#### **vii. Management**

Two Qualifications were approved by the NSQC (**Annexure VI**). **The Chairman NSQC desired SSC to undertake a demand assessment for stenographer and related roles in English and Local Language particularly for government (Judiciary) setup across India. SSC agreed on submitting a report to NSDA and NSQC.**

#### **viii. Health**

The Joint Secretary (SD), MSDE informed about progress on the two meetings held subsequent to the meeting between Secretary MSDE and Secretary, Ministry of Health and FW. The committee was apprised that 19 qualifications have been concurred with slight modification by the Health Ministry. It was also informed that discussions are in progress with IGNOU for registration as Awarding Body for the ministry sponsored qualification files placed in the 20<sup>th</sup> meeting of the NSQC.

***The Committee decided that once final consensus is made between MSDE and MHW, further action on qualifications may be taken accordingly.***

#### **ix. Sports**

Two files were presented by the Consultant, NSDA. The Chairman NSQC enquired if the wellness sector had any overlap in the qualification of Fitness Trainer. NSDA informed that Beauty and Wellness sector has no overlap with Fitness Trainer qualification file. Further, the Committee enquired whether QF Sports Masseur would require prior approval of Health Ministry, the Sports SSC mentioned that they have screened this course through ISINC and taken the views from the specialist /doctors. The Chairman NSQC instructed the Sports SSC to submit the relevant paper work and desired that opinion of Health SSC be also obtained.

MHRD desired that the Sports SSC to submit the Qualification File of Physical Activity Trainer to NSDA on priority so that the same can be presented in the next NSQC. The SSC assured in this regard.

***The Committee approved the Qualification File of Fitness Trainer only. (Annexure VI).***

#### **x. Domestic Worker**

There were four Qualification files placed before the NSQC. Chairman NSQC mentioned that DG NSDA needs to have an internal discussion with NSDC, on

SMART portal and the requirement of accreditation norms. The DWSSC sought permission to run these courses pending completion of internal discussion between NSDA and NSDC, the Chairman NSDC informed that all those training centers that comply with the accreditation standards that will be discussed in the internal meeting of NSDA and NSDC, can run the specific courses. ***The Committee accorded in-principle approval to all four files subject to the compliance of the accreditation norms (Annexure VI).***

#### **xi. Beauty and Wellness**

A total 11 qualifications proposed by B&WSSC have been presented before NSQC for approval, out of which 3 qualifications belonged to wellness sub-sector. It was informed to the committee that there is no Line Ministry for Beauty and Wellness sector and therefore no specific Line Ministry recommendation was received. However, the M/o Ayush and M/o Health & Family Welfare were invited in Stakeholder meetings in NSDA and have been consulted for these QFs.

The Chairman, NSQC suggested that SSC should explore aspirational name for various job roles. NSQC approved all 11 QFs submitted by B&WSSC (**Annexure VI**).

#### **xii. Furniture & Fittings**

A total 7 qualifications were placed before NSQC for approval. It was informed to the committee that there is no direct Line Ministry for Furniture & Fitting sector so that line ministry recommendation could be taken. The Chairman, NSQC suggested that M/o Urban Development is involved in construction related work and therefore this ministry may be consulted for related job-role.

***The Committee approved all 7 QFs submitted by F&FSSC (Annexure VI) and suggested NSDA to consult M/o Urban Development and M/o MSME for future qualifications of F&FSSC.***

#### **xiii. Handicrafts**

***A total of 7 qualifications were placed before NSQC and the same was approved (Annexure VI).***

#### **xiv. Instrumentation**

***A total of 5 Qualifications were placed before NSQC and the same was approved. The list of all approved Qualifications is at Annexure VI.***

#### **xv. Retail**

A qualification named "Self Employed E Tailor" was presented by Retailer's Association Skill Council of India for NSQC approval. The qualification is designed

for a Special Project (Non Govt) under PMKVY. NSQC accorded approval with condition that the qualification is approved till the timeline of the special project. ***After that period, if the submitting body desires to continue the qualification, then it will again be presented to NSQC with the project report. The list of approved Qualification is at Annexure VI.***

#### **xvi. Ministry of Environment Forest & Climate Change**

The Chairman NSQC suggested that the qualifications submitted by the ministry are very relevant and should have a wider spread. ***The NSQC decided to constitute a committee headed by Ms. Jyotsna Sitling (Joint Secretary, MSDE) along with representation from MoEF&CC, NSDA and Tourism and Hospitality SSC for discussions on collaborations between the MoEF&CC and SSC to popularize these courses.***

The NSQC also suggested that for qualification on Water Auditing and Budgeting, Central Public Health and Environmental Engineering Organization (CPHEEO) and All India Institute of Hygiene and Public Health, Kolkata should be consulted. However, if no comments are received within a specific time period, the files may be treated as approved. The list of all approved Qualifications is at **(Annexure VI)**.

#### **xvii. C-DAC**

***With regards to the 6 Qualifications of CDAC, the NSQC suggested to share the Qualifications with UGC, MHRD, AICTE to have their views as these Qualifications are primarily academic in nature.***

The same decision is also applicable to Qualifications wherein NIELET is a Submitting Body.

#### **xviii. Green Jobs**

A total of 10 Qualifications were placed before the NSQC and same was approved. List of the approved Qualifications is at **Annexure VI**.

#### **xix. West Bengal Govt.**

***NSQC suggested to have consultation with Ministry of Drinking water and Sanitation on the qualification submitted by the State Govt. In case no comments are received within 3 weeks, the files may be treated as approved. The list of approved Qualification is at Annexure VI.***

#### **Addl. Agenda Item I:**

- a) Qualification of Makhana Grower cum Processor was placed on special request of Government of Bihar. The Committee approved the same.

**(b) Ayushmanmitra- Qualification was approved.** On the basis of input received from Ayushman Bharat Mission, HSSC apprised about change in notional hours from 90 hrs to 45 hrs. The Chairman NSQC desired to have a study report on appropriateness of hours and progression on the basis of pilot during first phase of certified trainees. The same was agreed by Dy. CEO, Ayushman Bharat.

**(c) Food Processing-The Committee accorded in-principle approval to 7 Qualifications based on Line Ministry concurrence.** However, it was suggested that QFs would be sent again to all stakeholders with a timeline of 2 weeks. If relevant comments received, files may be revised accordingly. If no comments are received then files would be treated as approved.

**(d) COIR Board-** The two Qualifications as presented by Coir Board were approved.

The list of all approved Qualifications is at Annexure VI.

**Addl. Agenda Item II: To consider NIOS as Awarding Body for NSQF qualifications**

Committee was informed that National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) was approved as 'non-statutory certifying body' by the NSQC in its 4<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 26<sup>th</sup> March 2015 but same has not been notified. The reminder letter has been sent to MSDE. **NSQC agreed that NIOS can be an awarding body for SSC courses provided that assessment is as per NSQF guidelines and a process audit as per NQAF to be developed by NSDA is adhered from time to time by NIOS. The list of qualification for which NIOS could be Awarding Body is at Annexure VII.**

**Addl. Agenda Item III: Inception Report of Sub-Committee on NSQF alignment of Upskilling Courses**

A presentation was made on NSQF alignment of Upskilling and Bridge Courses. A matrix for submission of Up skilling Qualifications was also shared to help in guiding the submitting bodies on the need of NSQF alignment before filling the detailed Qualification Files. **The Committee suggested that an expert committee from relevant Institutes may be constituted to design an overall framework on Up skilling and Bridge Courses.**

**Addl. Agenda IV: Approval of DGT files**

**All the Qualifications apart from Qualifications pertaining to health sector were approved by the NSQC. The Chairman, NSQC suggested DGT to seek concurrence of Ministry of Health & Family Welfare on health sector files. Therefore, 297 Qualifications were approved as given in Annexure VI.**

**In addition to above decisions, the Chairman NSQC instructed NSDA to constitute a committee comprising of eminent personalities from different**

*sectors. This Expert Committee would act as Advisory Body for NSQC and give its recommendation on all matters related to assigning of NSQF Level, Bridge Course, Credit assigning & Transfer and NOS repository. NSDA would identify at-least 05 experts, who could be considered to be a part of the Expert Committee and Chairman, NSQC would nominate the members of the Committee. NSDA would be the Secretariat of this Committee. The committee after suitable consultation at National and International Level would finalize their recommendations on all above issues for placing before subsequent NSQC.*

The Joint Secretary (Skill Development), MSDE informed that the fund available under SANKALP project could be utilized for these enrichment and process audit activities.

The meeting ended with vote of thanks to the Chair.

**Minutes of the meeting on National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC)  
agenda for National Skill Qualification Committee (NSQC)**

A meeting was held on 8<sup>th</sup> June 2018 at Ministry of Skill Development Entrepreneurship (MSDE) under the chairmanship of DG, NSDA/ Senior Advisor, MSDE to deliberate on the specific agenda submitted by National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) to NSDA before consideration of NSQC. The list of the participants is placed at **Annexure A**.

After a brief round of introduction, the agenda items were taken for discussion:-

**Agenda Item 1:**

**Approval to extend the “Next Review Date” of QP- NOS to 30<sup>th</sup> June 2019 or 3 years from the date of NSQC approval, whichever is later**

DDG (NSDA) informed that 1480 Qualifications have already expired by December 2017 and another 135 would expire by December 2018. The information sought by NSDA from all Sector Skills Councils (SSCs) in compliance to decision taken in the 19<sup>th</sup> meeting of NSQC has been received from 05 SSCs only which is under examination for placing before NSQC. To ensure smooth conduct of ongoing training, all such Qualifications which are currently being used under various Government schemes were agreed for a period up to completion of current batch. However, the SSCs will continue to provide information in prescribed format to NSDA for review of Qualifications as decided in the 19<sup>th</sup> meeting of NSQC.

**Agenda Item 2: Approval of Notional Hours for PMKVY 18-19 STT job roles**

As per the information submitted by NSDC, out of the total 139 Qualifications Files, 57 files have more than 25% variation in terms of notional hours w.r.t already approved Qualifications by NSQC, 15 Qualifications have less than 25% variation and 67 Qualifications have either similar or less variation in the notional hours.

Since increase in notional hours has direct financial implications, it was decided that for such Qualifications where the variation in notional hours is less than 25% they

may be placed before the NSQC for approval. . For remaining 57 Qualifications, NSDA may hold sectoral meetings to review them before placing in NSQC.

**Agenda Item 3: Post-facto Approval/provisional approval of job roles executed under PMKVY and PMKK**

As Government funding was to be made for NSQF compliant courses only post Dec 26<sup>th</sup> 2016, the PMKVY Steering Committee may be informed about such Qualifications which are not NSQF compliant but implemented under PMKVY. However, there are 22 Qualifications as on date which are running under PMKVY (as informed by NSDC) without NSQF compliance, it was decided that:

- a) if the tenure of the existing training courses is getting over than these may not be included under PMKVY until they are approved by the NSQC.
- b) if there are any Qualification for which allocation and target has already been given and trainings are undergoing, NSQC may consider post facto approval for such Qualifications.
- c) Qualifications which do not meet the statutory requirements should not be implemented under PMKVY.

**Agenda 4: NSDA to provide list of SSCs mapped to acceptable Line Ministries and their approving authorities**

It was decided that NSDA would map with the line ministries with SSCs to extent possible and share the same with NSDC and SSCs.

**Agenda 5: Guidelines and process for NSQF alignment of NOS and NOS based certification by awarding bodies.**

The 20<sup>th</sup> meeting of NSQC has already instructed NSDA to hold wider consultation with all stakeholders for NOS-based approval and submit report to NSQC. The process is going on in NSDA.

It was decided that NOS should not be used for assessment and certification in isolation but only as the combination of NOS in form of Qualification Pack (QP) for a job role. **It was agreed that NOS based assessment may not possible for entry**

Qualification/ fresh skilling but NSDA /NSDC to explore the option of NOS based assessment and certification for upskilling.

**Agenda 6: Provision of resolving issues and discrepancies in the NQR data.**

NSDA informed that during the meeting with all Central Ministries held on 22<sup>nd</sup> March, 2018, it was decided that all qualifications entered in the NQR will only be used for training so as to avoid any inconsistency in qualifications being reflected on the portal of SSC/NSDC.

It was also informed that NSDA has already constituted domain team with Nodal officer for NQR and NSDC may align their portal to NQR .

**Agenda 7: Approval is sought for incorporating “Percent Weightages” in the QP-NOS assessment criteria**

The proposal was agreed in -principle.

**Agenda 8: Approval for simplified template of QP-NOS which will be system generated**

NSDA informed that NIC is working for digitalisation of NSQF alignment process. It was decided that IT team of NSDC and NIC may coordinate with NSDA to have simpler and common format (to the extent possible) of the template. It was also suggested that NSDA may explore with NIC for “QP Builder” platform.

The meeting ended with vote of thanks to the Chair.




**Sub: guidelines for recognition of a University as Skill University in the State.**

No. 3653-SD MIS-48/2017/SDTE — The proposal for recognition of any existing Government / Private University of the State as Skill University by according the status of the Skill University to it was under active consideration of the Government. Hence, in order to facilitate the same, Government have been pleased to prescribe the following guidelines / eligibility criteria for recognition of the existing Government / Private Universities of the State as the Skill University —

1. The concerned University should have been in existence for minimum five years with approval of UGC and without any break.
2. It should have minimum five years of experience in imparting short term and long term skill training.
3. The University should have obtained National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) certification with at least 'A' Grade.
4. The University should have the experience of skilling 25,000 youth in last five years under Government programmes or Government agency sponsored schemes/ certification with a proven capacity to train at least 5,000 youth per annum.
5. It should have earned a national reputation on skill development.
6. It should have the experience of working with State Govt. Departments and Govt. of India Ministries / agencies in the field of skill development.
7. It should have established partnership with various agencies such as NSDC, NSG of the Ministry of Skill Development in the field of skill training and assessment.
8. It should have tie up arrangements with leading Institutes in the field of skill training.
