**AGENDA ITEM 05: Ratification of 'On-File' Approval for Revision of Qualifications/NOS/MC granted Interim Extension Till 30<sup>th</sup> April 2025**

- 5.1. In the 42<sup>nd</sup> NSQC meeting, the committee accorded approval to the 455 Qualifications till 30<sup>th</sup> April 2025 which were originally due for expiry from November 2024 to April 2025. The committee also directed that ABs shall ensure that the revision of all these qualifications is done well in time before the expiry of validity i.e before 30<sup>th</sup> April 2025. It may be brought to the attention of the Committee that the exact number is 453 since two (02) qualifications namely 'Manager- Waste Management' and 'Solar Photovoltaic Entrepreneur' were erroneously repeated.

### 6.3. Request for Change in Nomenclature for 01 qualification of Management & Entrepreneurship and Professional Skills Council (MEPSC)

6.3.1. The Management & Entrepreneurship and Professional Skills Council (MEPSC) has submitted request for change in the nomenclature of one (01) qualification - Environmental Sustainability Governance Specialist, approved in 42nd NSQC to pertaining to **Environmental Social Governance Specialist**, to align with the industry standards.

### **AGENDA ITEM 07: Re-Activation of 99 NSQF-Aligned and Approved Qualifications that were archived in 42<sup>nd</sup> NSQC owing to non-availability of content**

- 7.1. The NSQC in its 34th meeting held on 30th November 2023 directed all awarding bodies to ensure availability of the content for the qualifications within three months of the NSQC approval failing which the qualifications shall be archived.
- 7.2. In line with the above, pursuance of the mandate, all ABs were directed to submit an undertaking confirming that all NSQC approved qualifications have content available. Accordingly, in the 42<sup>nd</sup> NSQC meeting, a total of 753 qualifications were approved for archival due to non-availability of required content (Participant Handbook and Facilitator Guide) beyond the 90-day timeframe post NSQC approval based on undertakings submitted by 74 Awarding Bodies. However, once the ABs confirm the availability of content on the respective archived qualification, the qualifications shall be re-activated on NQR.
- 7.3. Also, the NSQC directed that the then balance 15 Awarding Bodies, which has not submitted the undertaking till 42<sup>nd</sup> NSQC be informed to comply with the instructions of NSQC pending which strict action including temporary suspension/de-recognition may be taken.
- 7.4. In view of the above, a communication was shared with the 15 ABs to comply with the NSQC direction vide email dated 6<sup>th</sup> May 2025.

- 7.5. Subsequently, post the 42<sup>nd</sup> NSQC, three (03) Awarding Bodies namely Handicraft SSC, Food Processing SSC and Healthcare SSC have submitted requests for **re-activation** for total 98 qualifications for which the content has been developed by the ABs. The following is the snapshot of **99 qualifications** proposed for **re-activation**, and the details are provided in **Annexure V**.

**AGENDA ITEM 8: Removal of the Current Age Criteria mentioned in the Qualifications and Age to be mentioned only in case of Legal Requirement and for Hazardous Jobs**

- 8.1. The NSQF alignment and approval of qualification is a comprehensive process and covers various aspects while evaluating a Qualification/MC/NOS which inter-alia includes minimum notional hours; minimum entry requirements; evidence of need; NSQF level in alignment with the level descriptors; progression pathways as well as age requirement in case of hazardous job/ legal requirements.
- 8.2. It has been observed that although the standard qualification file template refers to age as training age only in cases where there is a legal requirement, the ABs while submitting the qualification prescribe the age for all types of qualifications, even though it's not mandatory. Accordingly, the age being listed as part of qualification becomes a necessary criterion for training in the said qualification/s and at times becomes an impediment in implementation of qualification in various schemes.
- 8.3. To address this, it is proposed that for all other NSQF aligned and approved qualifications, the age mentioned as part of the qualification file shall be withdrawn apart from the following cases:
  - 8.3.1. Qualifications/Job-roles related to hazardous occupations.
  - 8.3.2. Qualifications mandating legal requirements.
  - 8.3.3. Qualification with specific/ special requirements.
- 8.4. In view of the above, ABs may communicate the list of qualifications where age is to be retained in accordance with para 8.3 above. In case no communication is received from the AB, within 2 weeks, it shall be presumed that AB has no objection in withdrawal of age criteria from the qualifications.

**AGENDA ITEM 9: Archival/Deactivation of Non-Active and Expired qualification from NQR Portal**

- 9.1. The National Qualification Register (NQR) portal is a centralized repository for all qualifications which are National Skills Qualification Framework (NSQF) aligned and approved by NSQC. These qualifications are approved with a validity period of 3 years, unless otherwise specified by the NSQC. Since the operationalization of NCVET, 8505 qualifications have been NSQF aligned.
- 9.2. NCVET follows the prescribed process of periodical archival of qualifications which fall under the below mentioned criteria:



- a) The validity of the qualification has expired and the concerned awarding bodies has not taken up the same for revision, hence all such qualification are deemed to be not required in the skill ecosystem.
  - b) Any entity which had got the qualifications NSQF aligned either during the time of NSDA or till 2021 with NCVET and is presently not a recognized awarding body (AB) of NCVET.
  - c) All such Qualifications where there is no/low training conducted and/or are inactive for more than a year.
  - d) Qualifications which have not been rationalised as per the National Credit Framework (NCrF) and revised National Skills Qualification Framework (NSQF).
  - e) NCVET recognised Awarding Body has requested for deactivation/archiving of their qualifications.
  - f) Qualifications which have no content (i.e trainers handbook and participant handbook) available even after 90 days of NSQC approval.
- 9.3. The archival of qualification is a continuous process and as on 4<sup>th</sup> May 2025 while NQR portal has 2685 active qualifications, a total of 5,820 qualifications have been archived based on approval in various NSQCs.
- 9.4. In line with the above, pursuant to the mandate and in accordance with the directions of NSQC to conduct regular audit of the NSQF aligned and approved qualifications to ensure that only the industry-relevant and active qualifications are seen on the public portal, NCVET had identified 607 Qualifications (versions) that needs to be archived from the NQR portal on account of expiry of their validity on April 2025 (including those granted interim validity till April and being archived owing to no trainings or on request of AB). The details of these 607 qualifications is at **Annexure VI** and the summary of Awarding Body wise archival is as below:

**Agenda Item No. 10: Introducing a System of Re-Assessment and Fixing the Minimum Pass Percentage for Skill Based Courses in Vocational Education, Training and Skilling (VETS)**

- 10.1. Pursuant to the decision taken during the 35<sup>th</sup> NSQC meeting held on 31<sup>st</sup> January 2024, a *Sub-Committee on Re-assessment and Fixing the Minimum Pass Percentage for Skill Based Courses in VETS* was constituted. The Sub-Committee undertook a study of qualifications offered by all Awarding Bodies (ABs) using a data-driven methodology. Accordingly, the Consultations were

held with key stakeholders, including the Directorate General of Training (DGT), the National Academy of RUDSETI, Higher Education Boards, Universities, School Education Boards, Assessment Agencies (AAs), and representatives from Industry.

10.2. During the consultation, it was noted that the skilling ecosystem in India is highly diverse, encompassing a wide range of learner profiles, implementation modes, and institutional frameworks. Furthermore, with the integration of the National Education Policy (NEP) and associated frameworks such as National Curriculum Framework (NCF), NHEQF (National Higher Education Qualification Framework), and the revised NSQF (National Skills Qualification Framework), a flexible and learner-centric approach is being emphasized, rendering a uniform or rigid benchmark unsuitable.

10.3. In view of the above, the final recommendation of the Sub-Committee, are as follows-

**a. Minimum Pass Percentage**

- i. It is not advisable to establish a uniform minimum pass percentage. However, the Awarding Body shall ensure that the prescribed minimum pass percentage is not less than 33%—in paralance with the widely accepted standards, especially in academics, in the country.
- ii. Awarding Body shall define the prescribed minimum pass percentage for all NSQF-aligned qualifications in the Qualification-file (Q-file).
- iii. The apex body i.e. National Skills Qualification Committee (NSQC) entrusted with the approval of qualifications shall undertake a thorough scrutiny of each qualification and grant approval.

**b. Re-assessment strategy**

- i. A learner shall be eligible for re-assessment. It shall be available for entire learning unit i.e. Qualification/ Standalone NOS/ Standalone Micro Credential (MC)/ Standalone Nano Credential (NC) for which the assessment has been conducted.
- ii. The number of times re-assessment may be availed shall be prescribed by the AB However, the AB shall ensure that the timeline does not exceed three years from the publication of the initial result of learning unit i.e. Qualification/ Standalone NOS/ Standalone Micro Credential (MC)/ Standalone Nano Credential (NC).
- iii. Details of re-assessment should not be reflected in any of the learner's document (like mark sheet, certificate etc.) for all qualifications.

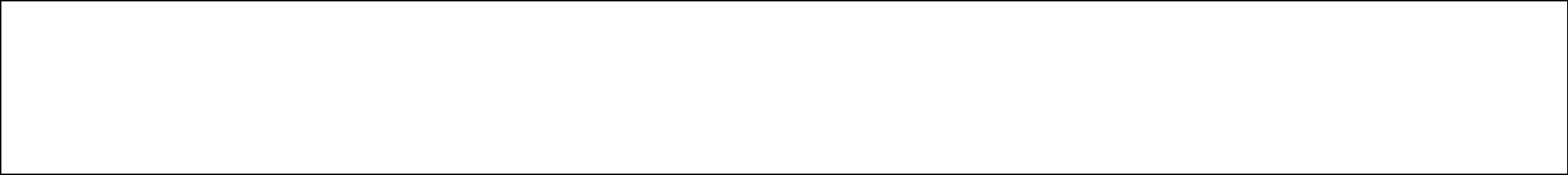
